Leadership Positions

An Order of the Arrow Troop Representative is a youth liaison between the local OA lodge or chapter and his troop. In his troop, he serves the Arrowman as well as adult leaders and Scouts who are not OA members. He encourages Arrowmen to participate in lodge and chapter events. He also works to strengthen the troop's camping program.

Qualifications:

- OA Member in good standing
- Must submit an application for leadership position to SPL
- Appointed by Senior Patrol Leader
- May not serve more than two consecutive terms, (1yr max)
- Scoutmaster Approval

Reports to: The Assistant Senior Patrol Leader

Adult Mentor: Scoutmaster and/or Assistant Scoutmaster also a Member in the OA

Trained by: Assistant Senior Patrol Leader with assistance from the Assistant Scoutmasters

OA Troop Representative duties:

- Serves as a communication link between the lodge or chapter and the troop.
- Encourages participation in monthly camping outings.
- Encourages participation in summer camp.
- Encourages older Scout participation in high adventure programs.
- Encourages Scouts to actively participate in community service projects.
- Encourages Arrowmen to assume leadership positions in the troop.
- Encourages Arrowmen in the troop to be active participants in the lodge and/or chapter activities and to seal their membership in the Order by becoming Brotherhood members.
- Participate in outings. Attendance expectation 60%
- Attend troop meetings. Attendance expectation 50%
- Sets a good example.
- Wear the field uniform (class A) correctly to all regular troop meetings and religious services.
- Wear the activity uniform (class B t-shirt) to all outings and other troop activities.
- Lives by the Scout Oath, Scout Law and OA Obligation.
- Shows Scout spirit
